



3 million people call Toronto home in 2019




Toronto is the fastest growing city, and part of the second fastest growing region, in North America.


4 million people will call Toronto home in 2041


Population growth forecast Toronto and rest of GTHA






Population Change by Source

The City spends less per resident than 10 years ago We've maintained affordability while making incremental investments








